The eHUBS consortium is proud to share its fourth newsletter with you!

Without opportunities to meet each other, or to meet potential users of the eHUBS, and a supply chain in the e-bike industry that must cope with a huge demand, the eHUBS-partners have made progress towards the full deployment of the eHUBS by spring this year. Most of the eHUBS will be in place as of June, and more will follow in July.

We are very happy to announce that the project succeeded in getting approval for an extension with new 2 pilot cities (Dublin and Inverness) and a whole region (Wallonia) to trial shared electric mobility hubs. With this extension, part of the project consortium, together with the new partners, will be working an extra year on the project. In addition to these pilot activities, we will also increase efforts to digitally integrate shared electric mobility hubs in Mobility as a Service applications.

Moreover, very soon we will be able to announce a new partner, which will deliver an e-bike scheme in Nijmegen / Arnhem. As soon as this is official, we will reveal the name!

If you are interested to get more information about how to organize eHUBS in your city, or how you, as shared mobility provider can work with cities, please connect with us. One of our goals is to make sure eHUBS are set up in more regions and cities throughout North West Europe.
