1	Project relevance <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - How well is a need for the project justified? - To what extent will the project contribute to the achievement of the Programme objectives? - How does the project go beyond the current situation and build on existing practices? 	15%
2	Partnership and cooperation rationale <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To what extent is the partnership composition relevant for the proposed project? - What added value does the cooperation bring? 	25%
3	Project intervention logic <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To what extent is the project intervention logic plausible? - To what extent will project outputs have an impact beyond project lifetime? 	10%

4	Work plan <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To what extent is the work plan realistic, consistent, and coherent? 	25%
5	Communication <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To what extent are communication activities appropriate to reach the relevant target groups and stakeholders? 	10%
6	Budget <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To what extent is the project budget used in accordance with the principles of economy, efficiency, and effectiveness? 	15%
