
Profile of the territory

BREST METROPOLIS IN FIGURES:

- 8 municipalities
- 215,000 inhabitants at the heart of a working area of 420,000 inhabitants
- 2^d metropolis of Brittany (3,3 millions inhabitants)
- 30,000 students, including 3,000 international students
- Total employment Brest métropole : 107 605 (of which 12,2% social & sustainable economy)


Objectives and strategy - the local Climate Plan








CAN SME - 2021/2023
