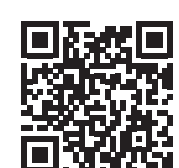
Safer habitats for farmland birds

Across Europe, farmland bird populations have declined dramatically over the past decades. Species such as lapwing, skylark, curlew and godwit depend on agricultural landscapes for nesting and feeding, but modern farming practices have made these habitats increasingly unsuitable.

FARMBIRD uses innovative technologies such as drones, sensors and artificial intelligence to help detect nests and track bird activity in agricultural fields. This information supports farmers and conservationists in adapting land management, protecting nests and creating safer habitats for bird populations.
